



# National Aboriginal Veterans Association

Regulations Governing  
The Issue of the

## Association's Medals

### Statute 1

All Authorized Medals will be issued from a single source the "National Kit Shop", Court Mounted.  
Applicants must be Members in good standing of the Provincial Chapter or Affiliated Association and N.A.V.A.  
All Sponsors must be Members in good standing of the Provincial Chapter or Affiliated Association and N.A.V.A.  
Recipients and Sponsors will be registered in the National Medal's Registry.  
A Medals' service fees will be paid in advance of issue.

### Statute 2

Eligible Recipients - Millennium Medal<sup>©</sup>

Aboriginal Veteran Member in good standing with documented Military Service in the Canadian Forces or Allied Forces and honourably discharged cited for merits service to the Association or the Aboriginal Community.  
Aboriginal Serving Member in good standing currently serving in the Canadian Forces a recipient of a Good Conduct Medal or other Canadian Forces merits service Wards or Citations.  
Aboriginal Veterans and Serving members, may be replicate recipients through further merits actions of a superior value.

### Statute 3

Eligible Recipients -Service Medal

Aboriginal Veteran Member in good standing with documented Military Service in the Canadian Forces or Allied Forces and honourably discharged.

### Statute 4

Eligible Recipients -Five Years Medal

Aboriginal Veteran Member in good standing with documented Military Service in the Canadian Forces or Allied Forces and honourably discharged, with 60 months of consecutive Membership in Good Standing.

### Statute 5

Eligible Recipients -Ten Years Medal

Aboriginal Veteran Member in good standing with documented Military Service in the Canadian Forces or Allied Forces and honourably discharged, with 120 months of consecutive Membership in Good Standing.

### Statute 6

All Applicants must be sponsored by either a Provincial or National Executive Officer.

All Applications must be signed by the National President or a designated Executive or Provincial Officer.

The National Aboriginal Veterans Association has the right to decline an Application without notice and reason, all decisions of the National Executive are confidential and final.

All National Aboriginal Veteran Association medals are the exclusive property of the Association, these rights of ownership extend pass a presentation.

The Association retains the right to repossess a Medal(s) obtained by fraud or by unauthorized means, through all legal actions required to recover the Associations property and all cost involved in the recovery process.

### Statute 7

Medal Presentations - Veteran Members: by a Provincial or National Executive Officer, or with *advance approval* the Governor General, Provincial Lt. Governors, Member of Parliament, Member of the Provincial Legislator, a Leading Member of the Veteran's Community such as the, Mayor, Police Chief, or other approve dignitary.

### Statute 8

Medal Presentations - Serving Member: as determined appropriate with *advance approval*, Medals may be presented by the Governor General, Provincial Lt. Governors, Flag Officers, Unit Commanders, Ship Captains, Commanding Officers of Regiments, Battalions, Companies, Squadrons, and other Military Units.

### Statute 9

Provincial Chapters and Affiliated Associations will receive all Applications and authenticate all Applicant's credentials originating within their territory.

Provincial Chapters and Affiliated Associations will conduct or make the arrangements for all Presentations within their Territory.

The National Association will conduct or make the arrangements for all Presentations in Ottawa Ontario.
